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Overview

Olympia "Libby" Bowker advises private sector entities, utilities, and municipalities on a range of environmental and land use matters.

Libby's experience includes:

Hazardous Waste Remediation and Cost Recovery: Libby counsels clients during hazardous waste remediation under state and federal regulatory schemes, including compliance with cost recovery processes. She also advises commercial service airports on handling PFAS contamination. She serves as Common Counsel for a group addressing VOC and PCB contamination under CERCLA and recently assisted a national pharmaceutical company with soil disposal compliance requirements during a large development project in Cambridge.

Wetlands: Libby's primary expertise is Massachusetts wetlands regulation, with detailed knowledge of the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act and municipal wetlands bylaws and ordinances. Libby advises the regulated community on permitting, enforcement and its limitations, and administrative appeals, and also counsel municipal clients during project review and enforcement proceedings. She teaches a bi-annual course on wetlands enforcement mechanisms and process. Recently, she secured a series of permits to repair a sea wall and rebuild a docking facility in Boston Harbor.

State Waterways Licensing: Libby counsels a national utility on compliance with Ch. 91 waterways licensing requirements. She is a co-author of the MCLE chapter on Tidelands and Waterways Law.

Prior to law school, Libby conducted oceanic temperature research aboard a research vessel based out of Woods Hole, Massachusetts, led a backcountry trail crew repairing remote sections of the Pacific Crest Trail, and taught outdoor science classes at the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry.
