

Anderson & Kreiger Attorneys Speak at 2022 ACI-NA Conference Spring Legal Affairs Conference

Anderson & Kreiger was pleased to participate in the Airports Council International-North America (ACI-NA) 2022 Legal Affairs Conference on May 4 – 7, 2022, in Tucson, AZ. The conference brings together airport legal professionals and consultants to identify and discuss the most pressing legal developments and issues associated with the airport industry.

Mina Makarious spoke on a panel regarding managing potential legal liability arising out of PFAS. The panel discussed the complex legal and regulatory issues resulting from the use of aqueous film forming foam (AFFF) which is required at U.S. commercial service airports.

Melissa Allison spoke on a panel regarding disruptive technologies at airports, which addressed legal issues raised by these new business models and lessons learned for regulating them. Melissa discussed best practices she has learned from litigating against, and advising airports on agreements with, emerging "peer to peer" rental car companies.
